A BILL

- To prescribe requirements relating to the management of the consolidated Federal asset commonly known as Plum Island, New York, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Plum Island Preserva-
- 5 tion Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. PERMANENT PRESERVATION OF PLUM ISLAND,
- 7 **NEW YORK.**
- 8 (a) In General.—The consolidated Federal asset
- 9 commonly known as Plum Island, New York, and all asso-

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1 ciated real and personal properties, including the Orient

- 2 Point, New York, terminal and facilities (referred to in
- 3 this section as "Plum Island"), shall be protected in per-
- 4 petuity for the purposes of—
- 5 (1) ecological conservation;
- 6 (2) discovery and celebration of the historical
- 7 and cultural heritage of Plum Island; and
- 8 (3) maintaining access to Plum Island.
- 9 (b) REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 180 days after
- 10 the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of
- 11 General Services (referred to in this section as the "Ad-
- 12 ministrator"), in consultation with the Secretary of Home-
- 13 land Security, the Secretary of the Interior, relevant Fed-
- 14 eral and State agencies, Tribal governments, and other
- 15 stakeholders, shall initiate a process to commence formal
- 16 visioning sessions that may form the basis for a future
- 17 ecological management plan for Plum Island in accordance
- 18 with subsection (a).
- 19 (c) Reports.—Not later than 2 years after the date
- 20 on which the Administrator, in consultation with the Sec-
- 21 retary of Homeland Security, the Secretary of the Interior,
- 22 relevant Federal and State agencies, Tribal governments,
- 23 and other stakeholders, initiates the process required
- 24 under subsection (b), and each year thereafter until the
- 25 date that is 1 year after the date on which the visioning

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sessions required under that subsection are completed, the Administrator shall submit to the Committees on Home-3 land Security and Governmental Affairs and Energy and 4 Natural Resources of the Senate and the Committees on 5 Energy and Commerce, Natural Resources, and Oversight and Accountability of the House of Representatives a re-6 7 port that describes— 8 (1) the Federal and State agencies, Tribal gov-9 ernments, and other stakeholders consulted during 10 those visioning sessions; 11 (2) the items discussed or reviewed during that 12 process for the period covered by the applicable re-13 port; 14 (3) the outcomes of that process, or expected 15 outcomes if the process is ongoing; 16 (4) if that process is not completed, the esti-17 mated timeline for completion; and 18 (5) if that process is completed, the rec-19 ommendations from those visioning sessions that 20 may form the basis for a future ecological manage-21 ment plan for Plum Island.
